

# President's Report - Physical Activity Tool kit

How can we increase daily physical activity participation among children living with CHD?

- The trial investigates the provision of physical activity counselling, resources and kinesiology support to children living with congenital heart defects (CHD) as part of their routine clinical care. We will measure to see if this intervention increases the children's level of physical activity
- Some of the resources included in the toolkit intervention are:
  - Information on the importance of outdoor play
  - How to choose safe activities
  - A searchable web site with an array of activity selections and programs
  - One on one kinesiology support
  - Heart rate monitoring information
  - Healthy lifestyle history questionnaire
  - Tips on how to approach physical activity without fear
  - Use of a pedometer

# OVER THE LAST YEAR <u>100+</u> PARTICIPANTS HAVE ENROLLED IN THE PROJECT ACROSS THREE SITES.

(Ottawa, London & Edmonton)

A total of 47 children between the ages of 5-17 have completed the project at this time. Recruitment is ongoing in hopes for additional participation.





# President's Report - Research

- Published 2 collaborative papers with Ryerson University
  - Historical Investigation of Medical Treatment for Adult Congenital Heart Disease: A Canadian Perspective published in Congenital Heart Disease
  - O Continuity of care for adults living in the community who have been diagnosed with congenital heart disease published in *Primary Health Care*
- CCHA invited to join newly established Canadian Research Network for Adult Congenital Heart Disease Interventions (CRN-ACHDi) as pillar partner and collaborator



### President's Report - CHD Landscape in Canada

- CHD landscape across Canada is comprised of a small number (relative to the CHD population size) of specialized clinics servicing the healthcare needs of people living with CHD.
- Tremendous progress and advancements in CHD pediatric care over the last 50 years
- More individuals living well into adulthood and surviving with more complex conditions and needs
- A number of smaller, local CHD support organizations have formed to service the auxiliary needs of CHD patients
- Currently there is no:
  - o unifying body across these smaller organization/networks to help share learnings and best practices
  - o national voice to elevate/advocate for larger issues and concerns for CHD care
- Research/information remains siloed and regionally based, with little industry support

With these significant gaps and needs being brought to light, there is a case to look at how CCHA can evolve as an organization with the purpose of being a unifying body connecting patient groups, research and the professional CHD community together.



### President's Report - CHD Survey: Key Insights

- Social media, word of mouth and clinics are key awareness drivers while parents and patients are key persons interested in CCHA
- CCHA's website requires an overhaul with better Search Engine Optimization infrastructure to capture Canadian audiences
- Key Areas of focus and interest and where CCHA can add value are:


